Summary of Values

"The California State University (CSU or University) is committed to maintaining an inclusive and equitable community that values diversity and fosters mutual respect. We embrace our community differences in:

- Age,
 Disability (physical and mental),
 Gender (or sex),
 Gender (or sex),
- Gender Identity (including nonbinary and transgender),
- Gender Expression, Genetic Information,
- Marital Status.
- Medical Condition,
- Race or Ethnicity (including color, caste, or ancestry), Religion (or religious creed), Sexual Orientation,

- Veteran or Military Status

All Students and Employees have the right to participate fully in CSU programs, activities, and employment free from Discrimination, Harassment, Sexual Misconduct, Sexual Exploitation, Dating Violence, Domestic Violence, Stalking and Retaliation."

Prohibited Conduct



An adverse action against someone because of their protected status

- Engaging in any sexual activity without first obtaining Affirmative Consent to the specific activity
 - Affirmative Consent means an agreement to engage in sexual activity that is:
 - Informed.
 - Affirmative,
 - Conscious.
 - Voluntary, and
 - Mutual

- Unwelcome verbal, nonverbal or physical conduct of a sexual nature
- Must be sufficiently severe, persistent, or pervasive


- A person taking sexual advantage of another person for the benefit of anyone other than that person without that person's consent
- Example: The recording of images, including video or photograph, or audio of another person's sexual activity or intimate parts, without that person's consent
- Example: The distribution of images, including video or photographs, or audio of another person's sexual activity or intimate parts, if the individual distribution of images or audio knows or should have known that the person depicted in the images or audio did not consent to the disclosure.

Dating Violence, Domestic Violence, Relationship Violence

Physical violence or threat of physical violence committed by a person who is or has been in a social relationship of a romantic or intimate nature with the Complainant

- Engaging in a Course of Conduct directed at a specific person that would cause a reasonable person to fear for the safety of self or others' safety or to suffer Substantial Emotional Distress
- **Prohibited Consensual Relationships**
 - A consensual sexual or romantic relationship between an Employee and any Student over whom they have authority
- Retaliation for engaging Protected Activities under this **Policy** reporting, opposing conduct. participating investigation)

Title IX requires the university to designate a Title IX Coordinator to monitor and oversee overall Title IX compliance.
