

Victorian Weirdness

The Victorian Era was a peculiar time to live in. The social-political backdrop and the life and reign of

Queen Victoria had a major impact on the art and architecture of this period. The Industrial Revolution required architects to rethink their designs and adapt them to the needs of the people who were finding it difficult to survive. The life of Victorian society was often filled with rapidly changing morals, resulting in some curious, weird, and creepy oddities. This two part lecture will give us a look at the art and architectural movements of the time, including the Gothic Revival period, the Pre-Raphaelite Brotherhood, and the Arts and Crafts movement, as well as some of the more peculiar designs of the period, such as hair sculptures and poisonous wallpaper.

Join historian Micheline Golden to hear about the camps, the dedicated women who built them, and how the young women of the Central Valley embraced outdoor learning in the Sierra Nevada.
