ABOUT THE PROGRAM

The Criminology major is designed to prepare students for beginning professional work in criminal justice and to provide preparation for graduate work including law school.

Criminology courses at the undergraduate level include integration of theoretical and applied materials of an interdisciplinary nature. The law enforcement option is designed for students interested in careers with federal, state, and local law enforcement agencies, or law enforcement careers within the private sector. An internship course is required in the law enforcement option.

Please Note: The South Valley CRIM/LE program is a cohort driven program.

Candidates/students may become ineligible for the program if:

- They enroll in another cohort program (e.g. Crim 108) while enrolled in the CRIM/LE cohort.
- They do not successfully complete all cohort courses with a grade of "C" or better.
- They take courses out of the prescribed sequence and/or in combination with any other courses

MINIMUM REQUIREMENTS

- Admission to Fresno State as a transfer student
- ADT in Administration of Justice is strongly recommended
- Completion of all prerequisite courses listed below with a 'C' grade or better
 - Al Oral Communication
 - A2 Written Communication
 - A3 Critical Thinking
 - o B4 Quantitative Reasoning
- For South Valley Cohort, Complete the following lower-division major requirments

 - CRIM 20
 - CRIM 50
