## Public Health Panel Covid in Fresno County

#### JUNE 17 | Thursday | 1 - 2:30 p.m.

Covid-19 launched a public health crisis that changed the world. This public health panel will reflect on the pandemic response and describe their work to protect and inform Fresno County residents.

Just months before the Covid crisis, Dr. Rais Vohra agreed to serve as Interim Health Officer for the Fresno County Department of Public Health (FCPH), on Ioan from Community Regional Medical Center where he worked in emergency medicine. He also serves as lead for the region's Poison Control Center, and is a professor of clinical medicine and pharmacy at UCSF Fresno.

Dr. Sukhjit Dhillon, an emergency medicine specialist (and Fresno State alum!) helped FCPH and Dr. Vorha by writing guidelines and protocols using Centers for Disease Control and Prevention recommendations.

Dr. John Zweifler serves as a Medical Consultant for FCPH and is a family physician with more than 30 years of experience in medical leadership and education, as well as clinical practice caring for rural and underserved populations.

Yuri Gagarin The First Person in Space

More than 50 years after his tragic death, Yuri Gagarin, the first person in space, is still acclaimed throughout the world. Yet Gagarin's life is debated and controversial, from his childhood to his years with the Russian space program. This presentation will chronicle his early years; how he came to fly; Valentina Gagarina, the great love of his life; why he became the first man in space; what happened to him afterwards; and finally, his enduring legacy.

"Well, Actually..." The Problem with Internet Myth-Busting

JULY 14 | Wednesday | 1 - 2:30 p.m.

The Internet loves science...or at least what it perceives science to be. It also loves myth-busting. These characteristics produce a web culture that delights in taking a commonly held scientific belief and holding it up for criticism. However, many of the "corrections" keyboard warriors so delight in providing are, themselves, inaccurate. Science, after all, rarely speaks in absolutes. Here, we'll examine some science "myths" (the human tongue has taste zones, the Bernoulli Principle allows planes to fly), the claims by which they have been "debunked," and the scientific realities, to find the truth and examine the utility of "well, actually..." culture.

#### Presenter: Lanny Larson

Last summer, news was dominated by Covid, presidential politics and racial issues. They're all back this summer, but we can add California politics, drought and who knows what by the time we renew

#### Operation Freedom - The Berlin Airlift WEDNESDAY | June 30 2 - 3:30 p.m.



It was perhaps one of the greatest adventures in American military history: the Berlin airlift of 1948-49! When Soviet troops closed all access routes to West Berlin by land, sea, and rail, thus threatening the lives of



2.5 million people and provoking the first major international crisis of the Cold War, American General Lucius D. Clay did not hesitate and proceeded to build a bold and fantastic bridge across the sky, involving 700 planes and 250 000 flights over a period of 14 months! Join German Historian Anette Isaacs for a fascinating discussion of this exciting time in her country's postwar history.

#### History of Sicily THURSDAYS | July 1, 8, 15, 22 1 - 2:30 p.m.

#### Presenter: Dr. Douglas Kenning

Sicily was the most mythic, mistreated, and monster-plagued place in the Mediterranean. Twice Sicily has enjoyed a Golden Age when she was a pivot of western civilization, only to be exploited and left desolate. Hers is a tragic epic populated with heroes from Ulysses to Archimedes to Garibaldi, and monsters from Cyclops to Hades to Mafia bosses. On the wings of her stories, and images of her art and land, we will travel her 3000 years. Douglas Kenning, Ph.D., lives half of each year in Sicily, where he runs a small tour business, and half in the San Francisco Bay Area, giving lecture series on subjects related to the histories and cultures of Mediterranean peoples.

#### Literary Giants of the 19th Century WEDNESDAYS | July 7, 14 10 - 11:30 a.m.



#### Presenter: Gary Walker

This course looks at each author's respective environments, motivations, early and later works, and the extent to which their reputations increased or lessened over time. Two of the writers examined were women and three were an important



part of a golden age of literature which flourished during the nineteenth century in Europe. Class two highlights three Americans who helped inaugurate our own increasing significance of great literature on the world stage. In the end, all six authors struggled with one issue or another, proving once again that genius in any field is never easy.

#### Ode to Beethoven

TUESDAY | July 20 2 - 3:30 p.m.



#### Presenter: Anette Isaacs

Music lovers all over the world are currently enjoying the "Beethoven year" which marks the legendary composer's 250th birthday. To this day, German born Ludwig van Beethoven is the most listened to creator of classical music. Join German Historian Anette Isaacs for an intimate look at the life and times of this tragic genius who was as famous for his fiery personality as for his divine ability to turn his personal struggles into supreme and powerful melodies.

#### Science in Shakespeare's World WEDNESDAY | July 21 10 - 11:30 a.m.



Shakespeare lived during the Scientific Revolution, during which scientific understanding was evolving rapidly. For the first time, academics were writing in English rather than Latin, which made these revolutionary discoveries available



to the average educated individual, Shakespeare among them. From praise for Galileo hidden in "Cymbeline" to the possibility that one of his plays is written as an allegory for the move toward heliocentrism, Shakespeare's writing is full of evidence that he was a science enthusiast.

#### The Historical King Arthur WEDNESDAY | July 21 12 - 1:30 p.m.

#### Presenter: Dr. Diane Facinelli

What is the historical and/or pseudo-historical basis for the legend of King Arthur? Was he an actual person? Was he a king? Was he a composite of several leaders? When did his legend begin, and what might be some





reasons behind its development? We will look at the evidence – historical, archeological, and literary – for the birth, growth, and significance of the legend of King Arthur and his court at Camelot.

#### Armchair Traveler: St. Petersburg WEDNESDAYS | July 28, August 4, 11 1 - 2:30 p.m.




#### Presenter: Dr. Asya Pereltsvaig

St. Petersburg is Russia's second-largest city, its cultural heart and Dr. Asya Pereltsvaig's hometown. For almost 200 years, it served as Russia's capital: the reforms of Peter the Great; the 1825 Decembrist revolt; the Bolshevik Revolution; and the 900-day-long siege during World War II played out on the city's stage. Splendid architectural gems make St. Petersburg a veritable open-air museum. Asya earned her Ph.D. in Linguistics at McGill University and has been teaching about language, linguistics, history, and Russia in adult education programs. She is the author of five scholarly books and 55 scientific articles in linguistics.

#### The Rise and Fall of the Berlin Wall TUESDAY | August 10 2 - 3:30 p.m.

#### Presenter: Anette Isaacs

With the rise of the Berlin Wall 60 years ago this August, the course of Germany's and especially of Berlin's history took a tragic turn. It would take 28 years for this cruel and inhuman symbol of Germany's division to come down, thus giving birth to yet another period in this European nation's remarkable evolution. Join German Historian and ex-Berliner Anette Isaacs, M.A., as she presents you with a historical and political overview of this painful but also almost miraculous period in Berlin's captivating history.
